



URGENT ALERT! (Updated 6-17-10)

1) Revenue Problems Continue (see below)

1st-> Lien Certificate delays, caused by the Tax Amnesty program, are now down to about a week. Thank you for your patience.

2) New Procedure re: Department of Education and Use of the word "School."

2nd-> The PA Corporation Bureau (Dept. of State) has apparently changed it's procedure regarding any filing in which the word "School" is used in the company name or as a descriptive word in the Business Activity block on the Docketing Statement. In order to be approved, these filings must be accompanied by a letter from the Department of Education authorizing the use of the word in the company name or in the description of business activity. We are still in the process of obtain the full details on this new procedure which has been in place for a short time now.

3-4-2010:

-> The PA State UCC Database is apparently back to normal working condition. Because the state did NOT, to the best of our knowledge, post a WARNING message on their site or shut down the UCC system during the last 3 days period, care should be taken when relying upon any PA State level UCC search dated 3-1-10 through 3-3-10.

-> New UCC Issue Just Discovered: When completing UCC-1's and UCC-3's if you type a notation like "See Box 13" in the debtor name box (UCC-1) or the changed/new debtor name box (UCC-3) then the UCC Division will input that notation as the debtor name rather than the actual debtor name that appears in Box 13 (which is on the addendum form). You might be tempted to type such a notation when you have an excessively long debtor name or, in the case of a UCC-3 more than one

debtor name that changed. The UCC, once indexed against a debtor name "See Box 13" will not be reported in a search for the actual debtor name.
